I am pleased to report that the Village has ended the year 2014 with a surplus in the General Fund. Council allocated \$130,000 of that surplus to the Capital Repairs and Major Projects Fund for 2015. Through 2014 revenues remained stable. We will continue to make every effort to keep expenses in line with revenues, so that we end 2015 with another balanced budget.

As the winter season begins to wind down, and we look forward to spring, I encourage you to visit the village website. It's a great opportunity to meet your fellow residents and neighbors.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Also, residents are encouraged to contact the Police Department directly for non-emergency concerns during business hours at 440-247-0155.

On a 24 hour basis for non-emergency concerns officers can be contacted directly at 440-479-8715.

Ex. House watch information can be relayed directly to the Police Department by calling 247-0155 during business hours, or 479-8715 on a 24 hour basis.

SERVICE DEPARTMENT

Remember to place your rubbish and recycling containers behind the line of the mailbox. This will make it easier and safer for our snowplow drivers and mailman.

Also note that every year your snowplow contractor should be registered with the Village. You can contact us to ensure that they are registered.

Large Item Pick-up

If you have a large item to dispose of, such as an old couch or washer and dryer, call the service department at 440-247-5055 ext. 11. Waste Management will pick up some large items on its regular trash day. If you put something out with your trash container let us know if it is not picked up by Waste Management.

If you have an item that has refrigerant, such as a refrigerator or freezer, the freon has to be purged from the unit before we can pick it up. The unit must have a tag stating the freon has been removed properly.
